### **Holiday Craft Supply List**

Thank you Jayne for helping us out with this!

- 15 to 16 Five inch squares. Small prints recommended
   If you are using one color bring 16 squares
   If you are using two colors bring 8 of each color
   If you are using three colors bring 5 of each and only 15
   are needed. No more than three is suggested.
  - Prepare your blocks by ironing them in half diagonally and then again diagonally to form a prairie point.
  - A strong needle that will go through several layers of fabric
  - A thimble if you use one.
  - Thread to match your fabric
  - Two button about an inch across (no shank buttons)
  - 1/8 ribbon if you want to hang your ornament but that can be added at home

# **Petaluma Quilt Guild Board Mtg Minutes**

November 18, 2024

Meeting called to order at 4:30 PM by Melissa H, President

**Board Members present:** Melissa H, President; Margo C, Vice President Program; Marilyn F, Treasurer; Shari K, Secretary; Debby L, Ways and Means; Ellie O, COTS.

Approval of the minutes from past meeting – There was no board meeting in October.

President: Melissa discussed the craft fairs and challenges getting members to sign up. She suggested we could investigate using something like Sign Up Genius to recruit and track volunteers. The craft fairs have been productive and we have also received significant donations. The December meeting will be a potluck at 6:00 on December 3rd. Last names starting with A-L are asked to bring a savory dish and last names M-Z are asked to bring a sweet dish. The agenda will include eating, visiting, and making a craft. The opportunity quilt and raffle tickets will be available. The meeting will be held at The Cottages Petaluma Clubhouse located at 576 N. McDowell Blvd. There is limited parking, so members will be encouraged to car pool. There will be a prairie point ornament to make at the meeting that will involve hand sewing, so members will be encouraged to bring needle, thread, and fabric. Instructions will be included in the newsletter. Due to the change in time and location for the meeting, the board decided to call members to let them know. Shari will send a call list to the board. There will also be information in the newsletter and e-blast to members.

**Treasurer**: Marilyn reported that there have been generous donations made to the guild. The board decided to use donations to support the general fund as the donations were not made to specific programs. The craft fairs are on track to earn the estimated revenue to support the budget.

**Opportunity Quilt:** Marilyn needs assistance to display the opportunity quilt at other guild meetings and events. We also need a committee to work on the 2025-26 Opportunity Quilt.

**Retreat**: Debby said that the Walker Creek retreat center is too expensive, the Community Center could be used to have a retreat that would not include overnight stay.

**Board Meetings:** The board meetings will be held on the 3rd Monday of the month at 4:30 PM at the East side Starbucks located at 205 N. McDowell Blvd, Petaluma.

We will soon drop off the final 15 to the Nation's Finest office in Santa Rosa in time for the holidays. Now as 2025 nears we would like to continue with the goal of at least 60 quilts, that's only 5 a month. Jayne recently went on a 4 day retreat and made 4 veteran tops, plus one for the Moonlighters community quilt project and in addition a personal quilt top too. It was so quick and easy to sew up the Veteran quilt kits with all the pieces pre-cut and ready to sew. We ask that if you have not taken a quilt top kit to come over to the table and check out what we have to offer. We also will continue to have squares bagged up and ready to sew just a block for those who don't want to commit to a whole top, Veteran Block of the Month. We have the 2 1/2 inch squares for a 25 patch block and the 3 inch squares for the 16 patch blocks. We would like to give you all a heartfelt thank you for all your efforts with this ongoing project that supports our veterans here in Sonoma County who are in need and we know they greatly appreciate the time and effort that goes into each stitch. #### **Block of the Month**

#### Wild Goose Chase Block

Fi Finished block = 16" x16"

#### Block consist of:

- · 3 solid white squares
- · 2 hourglass blocks, white background
- · 4 sets of 4 flying geese, white background

#### Colors

Ir

- · Squares and background for geese and hourglass: White,
- · Scrappy Blues and purples for geese and hourglass



· 4 at a time geese; 2 at a time hourglass


#### Instructions

- Cut White, sample uses Kona Snow:
  - · Center: 1 square 8 1/2";
  - Hourglass: 2 squares 5 ½";
  - White Corners: 2 squares 4 ½"
  - Flying geese background: 16 squares 27/8"
- Cut from each purple and blue, solid or small scale print
  - Hourglass: 2 squares 5 ½ " (1 blue and 1 purple)
  - Flying Geese: 2 squares 5 1/4" (4 squares total; 2 blue and 2 purple)
- Hourglass: Using the  $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares, make hourglass corners, one blue, one purple. You'll have an extra of each hourglass. Trim to  $4 \frac{1}{2}$  inches
- Geese: Make 4 sets of 4 flying geese, two blue, two purple, press seams away from geese points, towards the dark fabric, trim to 2 ½ " by 4 ½", sew in sets of 4

#### Assembly:

- Row 1: White 4 ½" square + 4 blue flying geese facing right + blue hourglass oriented per diagram
- Row 2: Set of 4 purple flying purple geese, facing down +White 8 ½" square + Set of 4 blue flying geese, facing upward
- Row 3: Purple hourglass, oriented per diagram + set of purple flying geese, facing left + white 4 ½" square







#### Need More Help with Techniques? Here are some resources


- Tutorial for whole Wild Goose block—this tutorial pieces the geese one at a time. If you want to do that, cutting instructions include:
  - 8 Blue and 8 purple rectangles, each measuring 2 ½ x 4 ½"
  - 32 white squares 2 1/2"
